


What have Year 4 been up to this week?



This week in English, we have been planning, drafting and editing our persuasive letters to Sir Keir Starmer regarding the current climate crisis. We have attempted to persuade him to help us reduce the use of single use plastics. This included the use of fronted adverbials, rhetorical questions and facts.



We also continued with our current text, called 'One Plastic Bag' by Miranda Paul. We have looked at vocabulary and prediction within the text.



This week in Maths lessons, we have completed our first end of section review for place value, before starting our new topic of addition. We looked at adding 9 and 99 mentally, before moving onto adding up to 4-digits without regrouping. We have done this pictorially and abstractly using the column method.

In other news, our Geography lessons have been rounded off by investigating the different uses of rivers in the UK, and then completing a mini case study on the River Thames. We used maps and satellite imaging to pin point notable landmarks that sit along its course.
