




## Year 6 Weekly Newsletter – 10<sup>th</sup> October 2025

What have Year 6 been up to this week?



This week in English, we explored the persuasive techniques of the rule of three and surreal similes to heighten the points made. We recapped the use of colons and semi-colons and applied these to given contexts. We also learnt how to effectively add detail to our points. We then applied all of our learning when writing a shorter, balanced discussion.

This week in maths, we have learnt different methods to efficiently calculate the first 10 multiples of a two-digit number. We learnt how to divide by a two-digit number by using the method of chunking before moving on to a more concise method. We then applied our knowledge to word problems.

In history this week, we learnt about the Civil Rights Movement and some of the key individuals who had a significant impact. We learnt about Martin Luther King's background and his 'I had a dream speech' before thinking of our own dreams and aspirations. We also learnt about Rosa Parks and the bus boycott and the impact this had on citizens in America.
