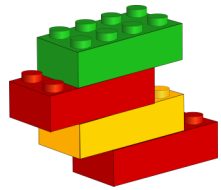


Structures

Specific focus: Houses and homes

This week, you will be learning all about different types of homes. You will use your re-search skills to find out about flats, houses and bungalows. There will be different types of homes in your local area. You will learn the different parts of a house and get to construct one yourself!



Lesson 1: Subject: Geography/Computing

Activity Outcome: Understand the different types of homes and find these in my local area.

Explain:

Activity 1: Use Google to search these different types of home: House (terraced, semi-detached and detached) flat and bungalow. What do you notice about each type of home? What makes them different? Find a picture on Google images for each one.

Activity 2: Go on a walk with your grown up around your local area. Use the sheet below to tick off each of the type of home you see. Did you see any others that weren't on the sheet? If so, which type?

Lesson 3: Subject: Geography

Activity Outcome: Draw and describe my home. Label each part.

Explain: Think about which type of home you live in. Is it a house? Flat? Bungalow?

Lesson 2: Subject: Geography

Lesson 4: Subject: DT

Activity Outcome: Construct a house out of recycled materials at home e.g. cardboard.

Explain:

You are going to construct a house out of recycled materials. Think about the different parts that you need to include; you might even construct one of the rooms for the house!

For example... You could construct the structure of the house out of cardboard and draw on the windows and extra parts. You also could use other recycled materials such as plastic to decorate your house.
