

Dear Parents/Carers,

Over the past two months, we have worked very hard to provide a service for the whole of our Featherstone Community. Key worker families have been on-site with us and we have kept in contact with you all with welfare calls (thanks for always taking the time to talk to us during these calls). The school has been a very different place but that sense of community has never been stronger. We are very much looking forward to welcoming children back but only when it is safe to do so. ## **Potential School Re-opening**

As you are certainly aware by now, schools have been told by the government to prepare for a wider re-opening for Reception, Year 1 and Year 6. You will get a letter today (this is a very important letter—please check your inbox) to inform you that Featherstone Primary School would re-open to Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 from Monday **8th June 2020**. Please read my letter in full for all of the details. It will be sent by 4.30pm latest.

### May Half Term

School will be closed from Monday 25th May until Friday 29th May so that the school site can be fully prepped for our re-opening. We will re-open for the children of critical workers from Monday 1st June and then for Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 from Monday 8th June.

## E-Safety

As it is half-term next week and school remains closed for many year groups for the foreseeable future, I ask this of parents. It is *vital* that you are keeping an eye on what your children are playing online, who they are speaking to and what messages they are sending. Make sure they are only playing age-appropriate games. If it says 18+, it is for a reason!

Our Muslim families have been fasting during the lockdown, which I know from personal experience has not been easy at all! It has been great to hear during the welfare calls all of the children that have been using their values and fasting for a little while also. However, this weekend welcomes the celebration of Eid and the end of the fasting period! I know it will be a very different Eid to what we are used to but I would like to wish all of out Muslim families *Eid Mubarak!* I'm sure we will all find ways to enjoy Eid in lockdown!
