Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to our final Weekly Home School Newsletter. Since the school closed at the end of March, each week, we have taken great pleasure in sharing your home learning photos that you have kindly sent to Mr. Douglas. In next week's newsletter, I look forward to sharing the children's back-to-school experiences.

My team have worked very hard in order to make the site safe for wider opening and on Monday 8th June, we are ready to safely welcome back the children of Reception; on Wednesday the Year 1 children join us and finally, on Friday, the Year 6s return. Please work with us next week to ensure that this return happens smoothly. In the meantime, as usual, this newsletter brings you important updates, reminders and of course, home learning photos.

Returning to School: Reception, Year 1 and Year 6

We understand that it is a worrying time for parents who are thinking about sending their children back to school. Please note that safety is our first priority. We therefore ask that if you have said that your child will not be returning, and you change your mind, you need to give school five working days' notice. This is because we will have to allocate them into a group as well as make other important safety arrangements. We will not be accepting children onto school site if we are not expecting them. Attendance is not compulsory but we need to know in advance for the safety of all children and staff.

Also, when bringing your children onto site next week, please do follow all of the signs that show you where to walk (always keep to the left) and where to queue up. Staff will be on-hand to help guide you also. The school will look very different but please rest assured that all the changes that we have made are for the safety of children and staff.

Communicating with staff

If you would like to speak to a member of staff, we ask that you do this by telephoning the school office on 0121 675 9740 or emailing enquiry@feathstn.bham.sch.uk Whilst the social distancing is in force, we ask that you do not approach staff to speak to them in person. We are always here to support you and speak to you regarding your queries but please phone or email in the first instance. Thank you for your support.

Free School Meals (FSM) & dinner arrangements

- If you are entitled to FSM and you have children in Years Reception, 1 and 6, and they are in school next week, then they will have a dinner in school.
- If you are entitled to FSM and **you are not** sending your Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 children to school next week, you have had the opportunity to order a FSM lunch to be collected from school. If you have ordered an FSM lunch, please make sure that you collect it.
- If you are entitled to benefits-related FSM and you have children in Years 2, 3, 4 or 5, you will shortly be receiving an Edenred eCode (4 weeks' entitlement).
- Year 6 parents: if you are not entitled to FSM, meals can be purchased through Parent Pay for £2.40 per day or you can send your child in with a packed lunch.

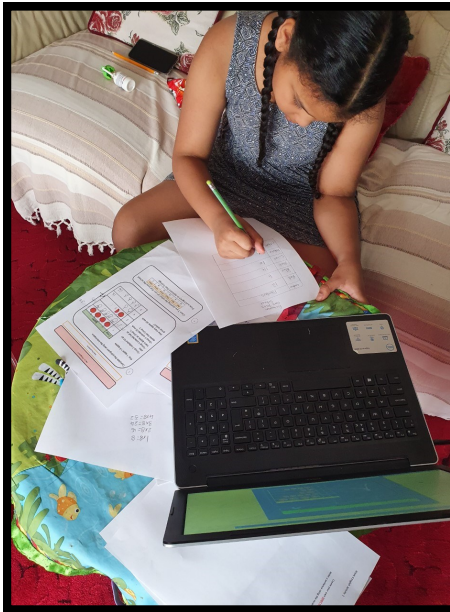

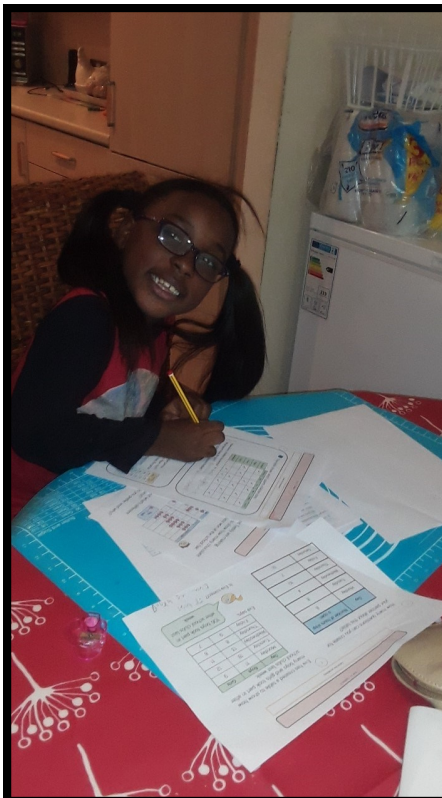

Value of the Month for June: Courtesy

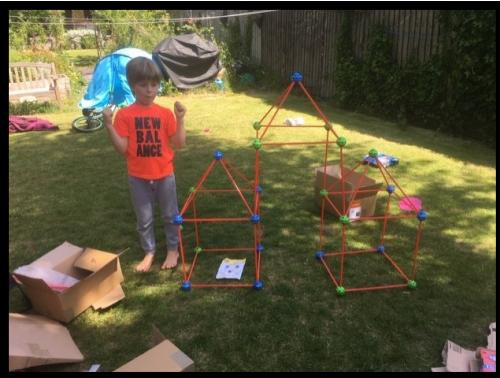

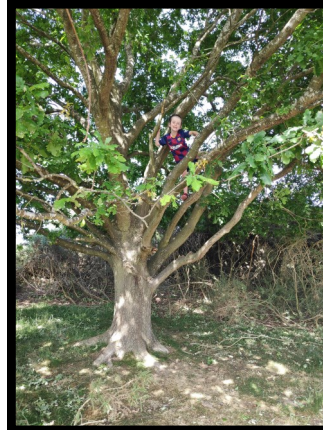
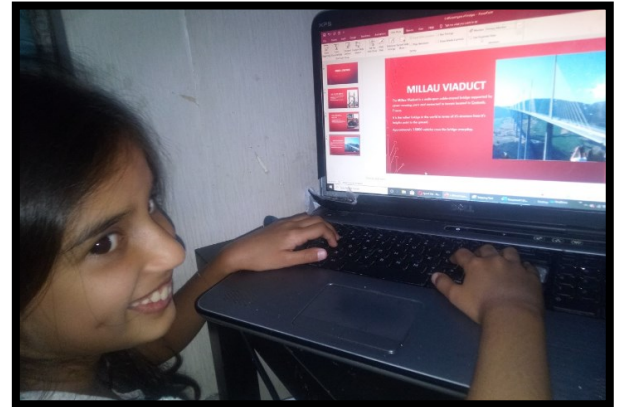
Above: Fabian, proud of his structure. He has done a lot of great work this week!
