Dear Parents/Carers,

Potential School Re-opening

This week, the Government announced its plans to re-open schools for EYFS, Year 1 and Year 6. This will be subject to the science departments telling the Government that schools are as safe as possible to re-open. I have already written to you about this earlier in the week. If you are a parent of EYFS, Year 1 or Year 6, please follow this <u>link</u> and complete our short questionnaire to let us know if you will or will not be sending your child to school from the 1st June.

May Half Term

If the June 1st reopening goes ahead, school will close on Friday 22nd May for all children so that my staff and I, who have operated on-site non-stop since late March, can fully prepare for the school re-opening. This will involve thorough deep cleans of the site, health and safety checks, area preparation to allow for social distancing, the installation of many automatic hand sanitiser stations around schools, kitchen preparation as well as many other factors needed for a safe and successful re-opening. School will re-open for EYFS, Year 1, Year 6 and children of critical workers on 1st June. (More information to follow).

Free School Meal (FSM) Vouchers

Sometime next week, families who are eligible for FSM from benefits will be receiving their second eCode from Edenred, the FSM provider. This eCode will be for two weeks' worth of FSM entitlement. 


Home Learning Questionnaire Results

Here are the results from our questionnaire about the home learning that we send out each week. The results are based on the 55 parents who completed the questionnaire.


Have you found the home learning resources useful?




Have the resources helped you to know what your children should be learning and practising at home?



Are the lessons too easy, too hard or just right?




Has your child enjoyed using the home learning resources?






