Free School Meals (FSM) Vouchers

A big thank you to the Government initiative that has meant that families who are entitled to benefits-related Free School Meals (FSM) have always received their eCode vouchers. They have supported Featherstone families with over £30,000 of food vouchers. Families who are entitled to benefits-related FSM will receive a £90 food voucher for each child that they have who is eligible for FSM on or around the 20th July 2020.

School Dinners

In September, for Autumn Term 1, the price of school dinners will be £84.00 for children who have dinners each day. If you want your child to have school dinners on a Thursday (pizza day) the cost will be £16.80.

'Wear and Share' Project

Yesterday, I wrote to all families with very important information about September. We will re-open for all pupils on **Monday 7th September** but the start and end times of the day are different. This is to manage the amount of people in one place at any one time. Here is a reminder of times, drop-off and collection points:

- \Rightarrow **Reception:** 8.50am-3.15pm. Drop off and collect at the Reception gates.
- ⇒ Year 1: 8.50am—3.15pm. Drop off at the back entrance to the school and collect from the Year 1 steps.
- \Rightarrow Year 2: 8.50am-3.15pm. Drop off and collect from the Year 2 classrooms at the back of the school.
- ⇒ Year 3 and Year 4: 8.55am—3.25pm. Drop off and collect at the back entrance to the school.
- \Rightarrow Year 5: 9.00am-3.30pm. Drop off at the side entrance near the bike shed and collect from the school hall.
- \Rightarrow Year 6: 9.00am-3.30pm. Drop off and collect from the side entrance near the bike shed.

It is really important that parents are punctual and stick to these arrangements for the safety of everyone and the smooth running of the school. Thank you.

Support for children during the six week and also for Year 6

We know however that there will be children and young people who will still need support over the summer. KOOTH, an online support platform for young people aged 11 – 25 where they can seek advice from a moderated support team in a completely anonymised forum. They are also able to access age appropriate articles and creative pieces and contribute themselves to share their work with others.

Kooth.com is available in your area, commissioned by your local NHS clinical commissioning group or Local Authority. They are available to children and young people in 77% of CCGs in England and look after 500k children and young people every year.

Kooth is hugely aware of the impact of COVID 19 on year 6 children. They have launched a specific transition campaign for Year 6 children which you can find <u>here</u>. Kooth.com is available 365 days per year with live counselling available 12 until 10pm every day.

What is Kooth?

Kooth.com is a free online mental health platform for children and young people. It is free for young people to access the service, no referral is needed and by creating an online profile young people remain anonymous whilst accessing direct counselling, and/or browsing the site for self-help information and guidance. The whole site is fully safeguarded and pre-moderated.

Kooth's multi-professional team includes BACP accredited counsellors, media workers (who moderate site content) and senior emotional well- being practitioners who are supported by a management team working to a clear clinical and quality governance framework.

XenZone has robust safeguarding practice which is robustly overseen by our senior clinical and safeguarding team. This ensures kooth.com is a safe, supportive and accessible service for young people in a non-stigmatising environment.

Who is Kooth for?

Any of your Year 6 students or secondary students that may need support with their mental health. They don't need a referral or parental permission. The service is anonymous and fully safeguarded.

No one can create a username, post a comment or create content without our team approving it. We work with young people who may be interested in exploring mental wellbeing - right through to those with ongoing mental health needs that may use us alongside or instead of traditional services face to face and CAMHS services.
