Year 4: A re-telling that has a clear order and plot. You give special attention to action parts and when characters speak: you use a very good tone of voice with expression throughout.

Years 5 and 6: All of Yr 3/4 expectations plus I expect you to tell me the *origins* of the myth/legend and any morals/meanings it has.
