#### Year 6 SATs

The Year 6 children have shown many of their school Values this week – including perseverance and self-belief – to sit all of their End of Key Stage Two Tests (SATs). The SATs tested all of the children's Reading, Grammar and Maths learning from the past four years. Despite the pandemic, children did an excellent job, worked hard and tried their very best! #### **Attendance**

As you know, it is the law that all children aged 5 and older must come to school. Unfortunately, there are still some parents whose children do not attend school regularly. Other parents take their children on illegal holidays during term time. Because of this, over recent weeks:

- 3 parents received a £433.00 Penalty Notice (fine) <u>each</u>
- 1 parent received a £120.00 Penalty Notice (fine)
- 10 parents all received a £60.00 Penalty Notice (fine) <u>each</u>

Children who have very good attendance (96%+) generally do much better in school than those whose attendance is not as good. Thank you to the very large majority of our parents who do support us in achieving high levels of attendance.



#### **The Coronation of King Charles III**

On Saturday 6th May, HRH King Charles III was coronated in an elaborate ceremony at Westminster Abbey. As you know from previous correspondence, we will be learning about this historic event on Thursday 18th May. On this day, children are invited to come into school in non-uniform, showcasing the colours of the UK. Each child will be bringing home a 'His Majesty King Charles Commemorative Medal.'

These are a gift to all children from Mr. Gaibee as a way to remember this event as part of their own history. We are all very much looking forward to this special day on the 18<sup>th</sup> May!

#### Environmentalism Showcase: 11th May

The Value of the Month for April was *Environmentalism*. Linking to Geography, children in each year group learnt about a range of environmental issues such as: the burning of fossil fuels, animal poaching and the littering of single-use plastic. These issues are very important and will, of course, continue to be an issue as the children grow up into adulthood. To help the children really care

about these world issues, on 11<sup>th</sup> May, year groups across the school partnered up for an Environmentalism Showcase. Each class hosted another class, showcased their Environmentalism artwork, discussed, questioned and generally raised awareness of the issue. The event was a huge success, with lots of communication skills being developed and environmental knowledge being learnt – please do ask your child about their Environmentalism focus.





# Mr. Douglas' Prosody Competition April/May 2023 theme: Perform a play!

April 23<sup>rd</sup> marks 459 years since the birth of one of the greatest playwrights ever, William Shakespeare. To celebrate this historic day, April/May's prosody competition allows you to get together with a few friends, write a mini script, and put on a short play!

#### What am I looking for?

William Shakespeare wrote three types of plays: tragedies (to scare/frighten the audience); comedies (to make the audience laugh with make believe and O.T.T. plots); and, histories (to inform and entertain the audience about past events). Your challenge, with friends in small groups, is to:

- Write a mini script (will it be a tragedy, comedy or history)? This <u>can</u> be based on a book if you'd like it to be.
- 2. Practise your script as often as you can!
- 3. Perform your finished play to me (time limit of 3mins).

I will be looking for good acting from everyone in the play, actions, facial expressions, a well-thought plot and clear and confident spoken lines.

Year 6: I will accept solo entries (soliloquies) of some of the scenes from *Macbeth* or *Midsummer* that we have read.




### **Miss Lacey's Writing Competition**
