#### Value of the Month – Respect

Featherstone Primary School is a Values-based school. We received the Values-based Education (VbE) Quality Mark Award in June 2021 to acknowledge our great work that we do with our Values.

The Value of the month for September is <u>Respect</u>. We teach and discuss Respect first because it underpins all of our other Values.

By the end of Year 6, we want children to understand that Respect is, "A feeling of deep admiration for someone or something based on their abilities, qualities or achievements." We teach children to have respect for other people, who may be different to them. Everyone has an ability, a part of their personality or something they have done well that deserves our respect.

A very important Value to start the year.

#### Place2Be

We are proud to continue working with Place2Be, our brilliant mental health and emotional wellbeing charity, who operate on-site five days a week. Place2Be offer two main services for children: (i) self-referral drop-in services for children, who can go and chat to Ciaran (our Place2Be Manager) about anything that's on their mind; (ii) clinical counselling for those children who are identified as maybe benefitting from it. #### Attendance and Punctuality

We take attendance and punctuality very seriously at Featherstone Primary School because children who are on-time for school and attend regularly, will do much better and be much happier than children who are not. #### COVID-19

Just a quick reminder about COVID-19.


#### Keeping up-to-date with school – Twitter
